



MAP Education offers students aged 11-16, who encounter obstacles in accessing traditional education, the chance to explore Art and Design, Music, and Digital Media. Alongside these creative disciplines, students are assisted in obtaining qualifications in Mathematics and English.



WHAT WE DO

APPROVED PROVIDER

Our education programme was set up in 2008 by MAP Charity as an LCC approved off site provider and offers Edexcel BTEC qualifications and are quality assured by Pearson Edexcel. We are happy to support schools and academies with Quality Assurance.

PROGRESSION OPPORTUNITIES

MAP Education courses are delivered in an environment that develops creativity, confidence and academic skills with the aim of readying learners to return to school or progress on to further education.

CREATIVE STUDY

Students have opportunities to experiment with graphics and illustration, digital photography and film, digital media, screen printing, DJing, painting, drawing and music production.

MATHS & ENGLISH

Within these creative subjects there are opportunities to embed elements of Maths and English, and we provide one to one assessor support to help students build upon these examples and then study and revise for their Maths and English qualifications and exams.



MEETING NEEDS



- Short term KS3 placements with a focus on returning to mainstream education.
- Longer term placements studying BTEC qualifications and Functional Skills.
- Providing places for students who are between long term placements, changing schools or moving between providers.
- Supporting students who are attending education after a long period of disengagement.
- Supporting students who have or are being assessed for EHCP and specialist placements.

CREATIVE DIGITAL MEDIA & MUSIC

This course gives learners access to a wide range of opportunities in music production and creative media. Throughout the course, learners complete a BTEC in Digital Media production which comes in different sizes to suit each learner's individual requirements.

Short term courses are also available (10 - 30 hours) which will allow students to attend for sixth day cover or respite. These are primarily targeted at KS3 students, but can be accessed by KS4 if needed.


ART & DESIGN



On the art course, there is an exciting selection of activities and areas of study, ranging from garment printing and photoshop, through to more traditional techniques like oil painting and watercolour.

Throughout the course, learners complete a BTEC in Art and Design which comes in different sizes to suit each learner's individual requirements. Some examples of the units that make up these qualifications are presented in the graphic below.


Maths & English



Our Maths and English course builds on examples that are already found within the creative activities undertaken at MAP, providing a practical way for students to relate to the Maths and English activities that they sometimes struggle with. We give students one to one support in working through a GCSE study and revision programme, or a functional skills programme – both of which use a range of computer based, paper based, and practical activities.

MAP Education understands the importance of GCSE exams and provides individual support for learners during mock and actual exam periods, to ensure that learners feel confident and prepared. For learners that cannot access mainstream GCSE exams, we offer the certificates below.

These other activities are of considerable value to the education programme as they offer the students a unique experience that raises aspirations and highlights options for progression.

At MAP Charity, we are keen that no learner is left behind (NEET) at the point of leaving school, and therefore work hard to ensure that Year 11 learners, have a progression route before they leave us. We support with careers advice, making applications to college, and attendance to interviews.
